Perhaps, because we are products of our fast-paced society, we tend to think and act as though God has short changed us when it comes to time. It is not uncommon to hear comments like, "There just isn't enough time in a day to do everything I need to do." "I just don't know where the time goes." "I'll try to find time, but I'm hard pressed for time at the present." In our day when many people meet themselves coming and going, most people feel pushed for time. The feeling is that there simply aren't enough hours in a day. Life with all its demands is far too busy.

Colossians 4:5

"Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time"

Time: Handle with Care

Before the creation of the world, time did not exist. For everyone and everything else but God, there was a beginning. We cannot comprehend the timelessness of God's existence.

God has no beginning or ending. He dwells in an everlasting now, without a past or future, without a yesterday or tomorrow.

On the other hand time is a creature word. We come into the world as babies, it takes time to mature and grow to adulthood, even in the activities of this life-careers, hobbies and secular learning, there is a law of slow growth requiring time, and so as it is in spiritual life. #### What is needed for a life of Prayer?

The more we recognize the need for God's help, the more we become aware of opportunities to glorify Him. There is no problem we face that having more of God will not solve. God made us in His own image, made us as independent as a created being can be, with individual wills, His plan is for us to yield our will to His. (Isaiah 43:7), when we truly recognize that we were created for God's glory we have a desire to see His plan for our lives fulfilled. Daily prayer is a way to acknowledge who is really in control of our lives

The first commandments is to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, mind and strength (Mark 12:30). The test of our love for Christ is in our obedience to Him (John 14:21).

The degree to which we love God will be demonstrated in our lives by the amount of our willingness to follow Him wherever He leads  
Obedience requires faith, without which, it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6). A life of faith requires prayer because by its very nature, faith depends on God not self.

Which one of us can say that we truly pray as we ought? or should? I can't. If we surrender our lives to His glory, He will teach us what it means to have fellowship with Him, and that includes prayer. No matter where we are in our spiritual walk, We can benefit by having more and more of God.

As I count the cost, I need to realize that having more of God means less of me

Jesus said, If any man will come after me, let Him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whosoever will save his life shall lose it; and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it (Matthew 16:24-25)

When it comes to the life of the self, gaining is losing and losing is gaining. For the child of God there is no other way.

It doesn't matter who we are or how gifted or how able or strong, we will never be able to meet every need around us nor accomplish all that we see needs to be done. However, we can find time and the ability to do what God is calling us to do.

### Jeremiah 33:3

And tell us about things beyond our human comprehension

He longs to draw us close so that we can know Him. Like a scared child calls

Out to a loving father in the next room, we too can call on Him knowing that

Will reveal to us things that would be impossible for us to know without his grace
